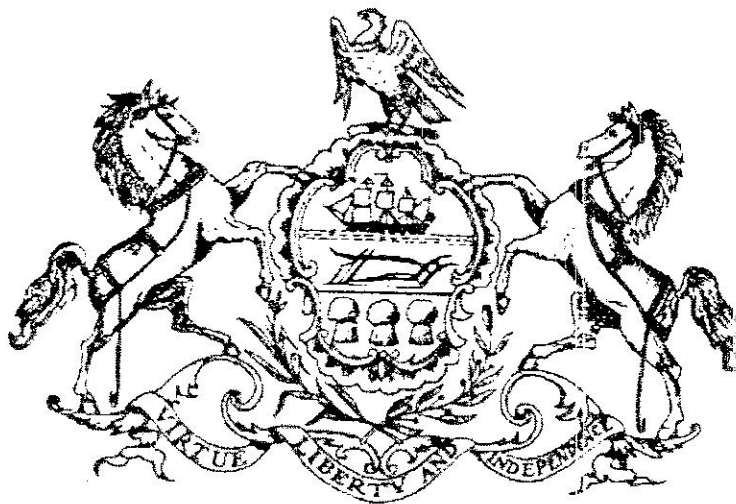

### GLEN LYON
