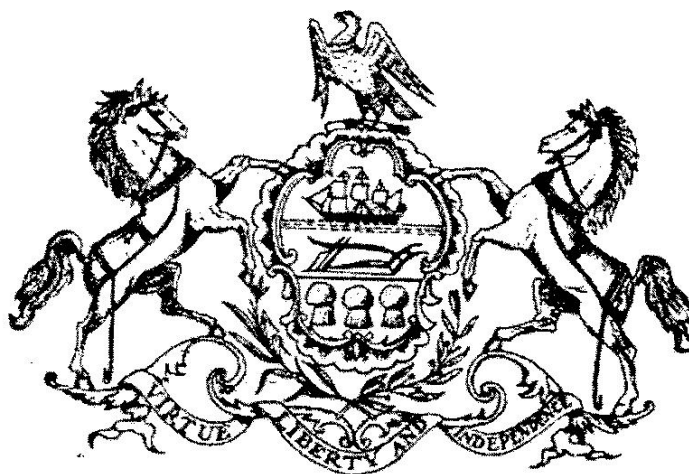

MONTH OF: November 2009

GLEN LYON

- Nov 2 - Police responded to a domestic disturbance on Orchard Street. A juvenile was taken into custody for assaulting his mother.
- Nov 3 - Police responded to a violation of the township burning ordinance on West Main Street for a male burning leaves at night. He was ordered to extinguish the fire
- Nov 3 - Police took a male into custody for a mental health evaluation after he exhibited signs that he was not thinking rationally and may be in danger to himself
- Nov 5 - Police received a report of a burglary at the Glen Lyon Pizza and Deli on West Main Street. Forced entry was used and money and coins from vending machines was taken. This is still under investigation and police suspect this was an inside job.
- Nov 7 - Police served a AWOL warrant for the Pennsylvania Nation Guard for a soldier that fail to show up for monthly drill training.
- Nov 8 - Police responded to a report of a female son, who was a drug addict, stealing coins and jewelry from her home. Police arrived and attempted to place the male in handcuffs. He resisted arrest and fought with officers. After a brief struggle, he was taken into custody with minor injuries.
- Nov 15 - Police were on routine patrol in the area of Depot Street when Police observed a male operating a ATV on the roadway with a female passenger. A lawful traffic stop was conducted and the driver was arrested for DUI and multiple traffic violations.
- Nov 21 - Police responded to a report of trespass at the Rock Street Apartments. The female caller stated that he ex boyfriend arrived at he home, where he was not wanted and refused to leave. The female called Police and the offender left prior to police arrival. Charges were file for defiant trespass.
- Nov 28 - A Glen Lyon resident was cited for the township burn ordinance for burning at night. He as warned on a prior occasion.

WANAMIE

Nov 6 - Police conducted a traffic stop on West Kirmar Parkway. Upon Police speaking to the driver, marijuana and drug paraphernalia was observed in plain view. The driver was arrested and is facing charges.

ALDEN

Nov 7 - Police responded to a report of alleged child abuse on East Kirmar Ave in Alden. Children and Youth was contacted and made a decision for the juvenile victim to stay with her biological father until Monday morning. The mother did not like this decision and began to argue and yell obscenities. After being given numerous warnings to discontinue her actions, officer attempted to place her under arrest. While putting hand cuffs on the female, she bite an officer on the finger and would not let go. Another Newport Officer was forced to deploy our TASER to reduce further injury to the bit officer. The bit officer sustained minor injuries.

Nov 4 - Police responded to a report of an attempted break in on Overlook Drive. No entry was made and no items were taken.
