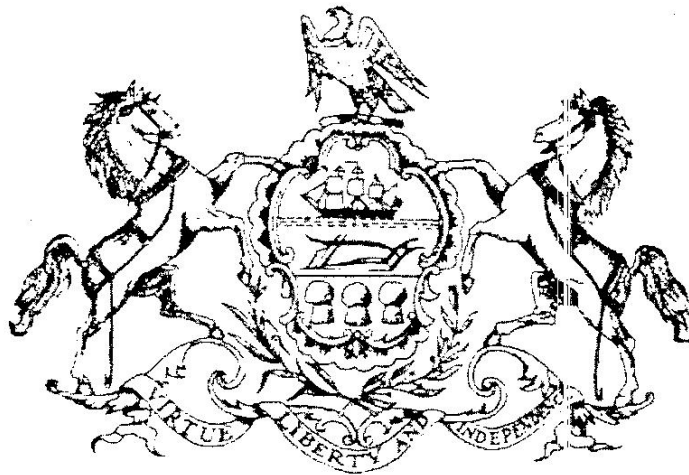

GLEN LYON

- Oct 1 - Police responded to a report of daytime Burglary on Arch Street. Prescription pills were taken. Police suspect a family member. Still under investigation
- Oct 4 - Police responded to a report a male that attempted to kill himself by taking an excessive amount of pills. He was taken to Geisinger Wyoming Valley and was 302' d.
- Oct 4 - Police responded to a report a pit bull running loose on West Main Street. The dog was captured by Police and transported to the SPCA. The owner was cited
- Oct 8 - While traveling through Nanticoke City, Newport Police observed a wanted male walking down Broad Street. He was taken into custody.
- Oct 18 - Police responded to a report a runaway juvenile, female from Newport Street. She was later found and brought back to her mother.

WANAMIE
